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12 *****A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "Controlling Population Growth."

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14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE MONTANA YMCA YOUTH LEGISLATURE:

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16 **SECTION 1 INTENT:** An effort to control overcrowding and population increase

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18 by controlling the number of children parents can have based upon their average

19

20 combined yearly income.

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22 **SECTION 2 PLAN:** The passage of the bill "Controlling Population Growth" will:

23 A. Limit the number of children based on the average combined yearly income

24 of the parents.

25 B. Inact punishments for additonal children not budgeted to the familys as

26 follows:

27 1. The families are required to pay economic penalties.

28 2. The families might be denied bonuses at their workplace.

29 3. The families are also required to pay for the additional children
30 to go to school and all the family's health care

31 4. If the before mentioned requirements can/ will not be met than

32 the actions as follows will take place

33 a. First time offenders will be given the option of adoption or
34 use of government welfare programs that monitor
35 parental spending and the care of the child.

36 b. Second time offenders will be forced to put the child or
37 children up for adoption and a percent of their monthly
38 income will be taken for the care of the children.

39 c. Third time offenders will be sterilized and the parents will
40 be
41 liable for the cost of the care of the children..

41 C. Not place punishments for the birth of more than one child at a time unless
42 parents are unable to provide adequate care, in which case the children
43 will
44 be put up for adoption.

44 D. Not place punishments on victims of rape in the bearing of a child, but
45 will
46 be given the option of keeping the child with government welfare help,
47 adoption, or abortion.

47 **SECTION 3 FUNDING:** Funding will come from the excess of money by
48 cutting

48 down on the use of government help and welfare programs and fewer births at
49 hospitals requiring money.

50 **SECTION 4 ENFORCEMENT:** Hospitals and individuals in society will alert
51 the

51 police of births and a census will be used to keep track of the income and births of
52 every family.

53 **SECTION 5 EFFECTIVE DATE:** This bill shall go into effect immediately
54 upon

54 passage.

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
