1 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "Act to require all convicted D.U.I offenders to display a  
2 special plate to identify them as such"

3  
4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE MONTANA YMCA YOUTH LEGISLATURE:

5  
6 Section 1. Upon the first offense, following initial punishment, offender will display  
7 license plate for no less than two years.

8  
9 Section 2. Upon the second offense, following initial punishment, offender will display  
10 license plate for no less than four years.

11  
12 Section 3. Upon the third offense, following initial punishment, offender will display  
13 license plate for no less than six years.

14  
15 Section 4. Upon the fourth offense and any offenses thereafter, following initial  
16 punishment, offender will display license plate for no less than ten years.

17  
18 Section 5. For the first and second offense a yellow plate will be issued. Upon receiving  
19 a third offense an orange plate will be used to show the increase in severity of the offense. If a  
20 fourth offense occurs a red plate will then be issued.

21  
22 Section 6. The lengths of punishment do not overlap, meaning, if an offender was to  
23 receive a third offense while serving for the second offense the offender will be required to  
24 display the appropriate plate until the end of the required time. At that time the offender will  
25 display the plate from the third offense for the required time.

26  
27 Section 7. This bill becomes effective upon passage.
