Defendant was convicted before the Cook County Circuit Court, Frank J. Wilson, J., of attempt burglary, and he appealed. The Appellate Court, Goldberg, P.J., held that evidence sustained conviction of defendant, who was found kneeling with a screwdriver in his hand attempting to pry open front door of apartment which he had not been given permission to enter.
