Proponents for the Institution of Montana Prostitution

Prostitution, frequently unjustly stigmatized in Montana society as unseemly, or immoral, can in fact benefit not only the men and women themselves that are employed in the trade, but Montana society as a whole. Here at Proponents for the Institution of Montana Prostitution, we take a more judicious tack. Nevada, and many countries in the European Union - most recently Great Britain - are liberalizing prostitution laws to the economic and safety of all.

Take Great Britain for example. Recently a law was passed in Parliament allowing a legal brothel with up to three prostitutes working under an employer's supervision. First, the previously dangerous practice in which prostitutes often encountered serious injury or death while working on the job is made safer; background checks and other safeguards are implemented within the brothels to guard against wayward customers. Also, taxation can provide a lucrative stimulus to the local economy. Great Britain is already seeing the monetary benefits of legalized brothels; Montana can too.
