Citizens Against Methamphetamine Production

Speaking for the citizens of Montana, I represent people concerned about the killer drug, Methamphetamine. My fellow citizens of Montana strive to rid our state of this killer drug by making the sale of cough, cold, asthma, and allergy medicines and dietary supplements sold as prescription drugs rather than over the counter. To clarify, a consumer cannot simply buy a medicine but instead must complete a form before obtaining these items.

The ready availability of the key ingredient of Methamphetamine contributes to making Montana the leading producer of Meth in the United States. However, if the legislature were to pass this laws restricting the sale of meth ingredients, researchers believe it will further discourage producers of Methamphetamine from buying these simple cold or allergy medicines. Under this legislation, only a pharmacist can distribute these medicines. If a pharmacist is not available, the weak drugs must be kept in a locked cabinet as well. As mentioned previously, consumers of these drugs must fill out a form before purchasing these drugs. These forms must be sent to the state to be thoroughly reviewed. The result of all of these actions should decrease the production of Meth should decrease considerably.

Not only will this type of legislation discourage Methamphetamine producers from buying their crucial ingredients, but it will also limit how much a person can buy. At most a customer may only buy two weeks worth of drugs the most at one time. They cannot return to buy more drugs until two weeks are complete. You may not purchase two weeks worth of drugs if you are under the age of eighteen.

As a lobbyist and a concerned citizen of Montana, I beseech you to vote for any bills that will limit the production of methamphetamine. It will sooth the pain of the wounds spread by methamphetamine in Montana.

I am in full support of any bill that supports the fight against Methamphetamine by limiting the sale and changing the format in which cold, asthma, and cough medicines are sold.
